**Level I is the state's mandatory education, Level II requires the remainder of hours is completed on an outpatient basis in most cases.**

(Completion of the minimum Level I state education hours and a minimum of 12 hours of early intervention.)

## **FEDERAL GUIDELINES**

### **When is a Level II ( 2 ) or Higher Education and Therapy Treatment Program Required?**

A Level II ( 2 ) is required when a driver is:

- Convicted of two ( 2 ) alcohol / drug violations that occurred within 5-10 years.
  - Convicted of three ( 3 ) or more alcohol / drug violations in a lifetime.
- Having a BAC of .15 ( .20 if offense was prior to 01-01-07 ) or more.
  - A refusal of a BAC is an automatic level II
- Revoked for multiple BAC tests of .08 or more (Per Se).

Note: The alcohol / drug treatment program the court orders you to complete for your DUI / DWI / DWAI / OWI / or similar offense may differ from the Department / Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV)

**\*\*\* It is important to understand that these guidelines are set by the States Committee's, but the Court and Probation may require more from you.**
